CITY OF VALLEJO TO HOLD 9-11 MEMORIAL CEREMONIES

VALLEJO – The City of Vallejo will hold ceremonies at the recently dedicated Police and Fire Memorial in honor of those who lost their lives in the 9-11 terrorist attacks in New York City, Washington D.C. and Pennsylvania.

The event will take place at noon on Thursday, September 11 in front of the memorial. Members of the police and fire department are expected to speak, followed by a moment of silence.

“We can never forget the events of Sept. 11, 2001,” said Mayor Tony Intintoli Jr. “Our ceremony will be a small remembrance in honor of those who died in that terrible tragedy. Our thoughts and prayers are with those victims and their families.”

American Flight 11 from Boston crashed into the North Tower at the World Trade Center in New York City at 8:46 a.m. Eastern time. Moments later, at 9:03 a.m., United Flight 175 from Boston slammed into the South Tower.

At 9:45 a.m., American Airlines Flight 77 crashed into The Pentagon, and at 10:10 a.m. United Flight 93 crashed into a wooded area in Pennsylvania. Between 9:45 and 10:10 a.m., the South Tower of the World Trade Center collapsed, while a large section of one side of the Pentagon also collapsed. by 10:28 a.m. the North Tower of the WTC had also collapsed.

Nearly 3,000 people lost their lives in the events of 9-11.
