## VALLEJO CRIMESTOPPERS NAMES NEW PRESIDENT; KEEPS WORKING

VALLEJO – An organization formed to assist Vallejo police in solving local crimes has selected a new president to lead it for the next year.

Robert Noyes, a longtime Vallejoan, was selected to be president of the organization, which wants to help reduce the crime rate in Vallejo.

"The mission of Crimestoppers is to offer rewards for tips that lead to the arrest and conviction of suspects of crimes that take place in Vallejo," Noyes said.

The local nonprofit agency was formed to help reduce the rate of crime in Vallejo.

"All of our funds are derived from the community and donations, which are then used to pay rewards for anonymous tips that lead to arrest of those involved in the crimes," Noyes said.

Vallejo Crimestoppers has helped solved bank robberies and homicides, helped pay for a drug-sniffing dog and assisted in solving a serial arson case, among other efforts.

Residents with information on crimes committed in Vallejo can call 644-STOP (7867) to report a crime. Callers can be anonymous and can leave a code name or number to claim their reward in the future.

"It's this kind of community effort that helps solve some of the toughest cases," said Vallejo Mayor Tony Intintoli. "Sometimes what seems like an insignificant tip can be the one that breaks a case wide open. I applaud the efforts of Vallejo Crimestoppers."
