
## Cal Maritime's New Entrance

The California Maritime Academy (CMA) began construction on August 8, building a new entrance.

Otto Construction is currently establishing the foundation for a Campus Police Facility which will be located at the front gate. The 3,800 square-foot building will include offices, investigation and interview rooms, and a new Emergency Operations Center. In addition to the new facility, the campus will receive a new entry gateway, kiosk and pedestrian entryway.

The building is being prefabricated by Mobil Modular, which will then be transported to the campus for installation. Funding for the \$1 million project is from the California State University capital improvement budget. The original timeline called for an opening in fall of 2014, but is anticipated to be completed ahead of schedule.

The new facility is one of many projects currently in progress at CMA. The Dining Center/Rental Hall is set to be complete by the end of the month. The Physical Education and Aquatics Center is still under construction and is scheduled to be open in fall of 2014.

## GVRD Vallejo Celebrates Youth

## St. Vincent's Historic Home Tour

The Saint Vincent's Historic District bungalows and carriage homes, built in the late 1800s and early 1900s by shipbuilders, are available for a self-guided tour this upcoming Sunday.

The homes on the tour will show a variety of architectural styles, including Greek Revival and Golden Rush cottages, bungalows, Dutch Colonial and Mediterranean Revival homes. In the old days, shipbuilders used salvaged materials from the Naval Shipyard to build their houses, integrating different styles and elements. The historic significance of this district lies in its growth as a workingman's neighborhood for shipbuilders.

The self-guided tour of the homes will be from 3:00 p.m. to 5:30 p.m., with a pre-tour Mad Hatter Tea Party reception at City Park from 2:00 p.m. to 3:30 p.m. Tickets are \$25 and are available online or in person at the Vallejo Naval and Historical Museum and the Vallejo Convention and Visitors Bureau. Profits support St. Vinnie's Community Gardens and the Mad Hatter Holiday Festival.



The tour will conclude at the McCree-Goudeau Gallery with a closing reception showcasing local artists and talent, with music, wine and edible delights. For additional information, call (925) 451-7682.

## Vallejo Unity Day
