


## Background and Discussion

- Council requested 1st Quarter (Q1) General Fund Update
- Mid-Year (Q2) Budget update to follow in March 2014


### National / Regional Context

#### Revenues

 Overall revenues estimated to increase by \$452,200 compared to FY 2013-14 Adopted Budget projections

#### Why aren't Property Tax revenues higher?

- Assessed values of properties up 8.13% in Vallejo
- Adopted Budget year over year increase 6.64%
- Potential revenue reduction from 86 pending appeals
- Prop 13 sets base year value and capped at 2% thereafter
- Prop 8 temporarily resets lower value but not capped

### Expenditures

- 81% of General Fund budget is Salaries and Benefits
- 448 employees on payroll
- \$3.1 Million bi-weekly payroll
- On target to achieve \$2 Million Vacancy Factor savings
- Services and Supplies expenditures "On-Budget"

### Next Steps

- Other Post Employment Benefits (OPEB) Trust
  - Evaluating Request for Qualifications responses
  - Expected to return to Council on December 17, 2013
  - For approval of Trust Structure and Contract for Services
  - Additional savings expected from implementation of OPEB Trust
  - Adjustment will be made at mid-year, once amounts are known

### Fiscal Impact

- General Fund revenues estimated to increase by \$452,200
- Measure B revenues estimated to increase by \$6,300
