The Vallejo Police Department had obtained arrest warrants for suspects in the Jesse Bethel student assault case. On January 29, 2009, one of the suspects sought in the case, a 15 year old male, turned himself in to police. The juvenile will be charged with attempted murder and tried as an adult.

On 1/15/09 at approximately 4:30 PM Vallejo Police Officers responded to the report of a fight at Jesse Bethel High School located at 1800 Ascot Parkway.

Upon arrival Patrol Officers located a 17 year old male victim unconscious. The Officers also located other victims who were physically assaulted and witnesses who provided an account of what had happened.

The investigation has resulted in the arrest of 26 year old Abraham Tili, 26 year old Alexander Tili, 18 year old Ray Tili, 18 year old Ron Tili, 18 year old Kevin Young, and a 16 year old juvenile. The suspects were arrested for attempted murder, assault with a deadly weapon, and being gang members involved gang related crime.

The incident was captured on video surveillance which shows the suspects repeatedly hitting, kicking and choking the victims.

The 17 year old victim was transported to an area hospital and is listed in serious condition.

The Vallejo Police Department Investigations Unit is continuing the investigation and feels that there will be additional arrests. Anyone with information about this incident is asked to call Detective Wentz at 707-648-4524.

On 01/15/09, at approximately 1635 Hrs, Vallejo PD Officers responded to Jesse Bethel High School on a call of a large fight with multiple suspects and victims. Following their arrival, officers located a juvenile victim unconscious and beaten badly about the face and torso. The assailants had fled the scene prior to police arrival, but were located a short time later at 913 Miller Ave. Alex Tili, Abraham Tili, Ron Tili, Ray Tili, Kevin Young II and a sixth juvenile suspect were taken into custody.

The video surveillance system at Jesse Bethel High School proved to be effective in that it clearly captured the entire assault. The victim was transported to a local hospital and is currently in stable condition.
